The new Veast began life in 2014, and was inspired by the Bold Greenfingers Men, a club founded in 1963 at the Dove Inn, which was in Southover (now closed and a private house). The Club raised money for the lifeboat fund, a tradition which the Veast follows - all our profits are in support of the RNLI. In the past the annual Veast saw members in 'fancy dress' parade to the clifftop, led by a kilted piper, and with a wheelbarrow to carry a barrel of cider. There was much singing, and cider consumption, which continued as the party returned to the Dove to enjoy themselves until

closing time. The Greenfingers Men are no more but we hope to continue to celebrate the tradition in music and song, and cider, and to support the RNLI.
