## BURTON BRADSTOCK CE SCHOOL

As I write this report we have just returned to school for the last half term



of the academic year. So far this half term there have been a number of different sporting activities on offer to the children. Class 4 visited the Sailing Academy on Portland where they had a fantastic time learning to sail and Year 5 pupils have also been to Colfox to enjoy the Sport Festival which is organised and run by the older students.

The school has taken part in Cup Football the World tournament run by sixth form students at Colfox and the **Ouadkids** athletics competition, also at Colfox. We continue to have a very popular after school football club which is run by some parents and a volunteer and introduced we have also basketball club this term which is being run by a professional coach, David Roper.





At the end of last half term we welcomed two inspectors into school that carried out a SIAMS Inspection (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools). The inspection involved a full day of interviews with staff, parents, governors pupils and as well observations, scrutiny of work and attending collective worship. We are very proud to be graded as a GOOD school and there are a number of

quotes from the report that we are proud of, such as:

- Children achieve well overall academically
- Relationships are a strength of the school
- The school is described by many as being a 'family'. A high profile is
  given to ensuring that all members of the school community are valued
  as individuals, made in the image of God, and well cared for in line with
  the school's values
- ...the learners' understanding that everyone has the right to believe what they choose and that others' viewpoints should be respected
- Behaviour in the school is at least good
- Children and staff engage in worship and most participate with enthusiasm
- Children respond with respect and reverence to prayer
- The oldest children lead celebration worship on a weekly basis and they do so confidently and with enthusiasm
- All members of the school community speak highly of the Open the Book team who plan and lead collective worship weekly
- She (the headteacher) speaks ardently about learners who have described the impact the school has had on their lives as a result of school staff meeting their individual needs
- The headteacher is well supported and challenged by a committed governing body who are well known by staff, children and parents
- The executive principal has shown great commitment in familiarising herself with the SIAMS agenda and the concept of a Christian education ... and as a result she is able to effectively support the headteacher in this regard
- Several special services each year are held in the church and the children talk positively about these and their involvement in them
- The headteacher is a passionate leader who shows elements of outstanding church school leadership.

The report gives three areas for future development, which are in line with areas already identified by the school staff and governors. These include:

- Working to produce a vision statement that clearly articulates the strong vision that the school already has
- Developing children's comprehension of what worship is and understanding of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit
- Refining formal systems for monitoring and evaluating the impact of collective worship

We played the **Kenway Cup quarter final** against Mrs Ethelston's and won 15-2. We will next play the semi-final against Parrett & Axe.

#### **BRIDE VALLEY GARDENING CLUB**

In May Steve Masters gave us an insight into the development of the wild flower meadows at Kingcombe as well as other aspects of conservation there.

At our monthly meeting on **July 17<sup>th</sup>** Malcolm Mills, from the Gold Club, will be speaking about 'Plants that changed the world'.

This year's Flower and Garden Produce Show takes place in LATCH on July 8th at 2.00pm (Free entry). All are welcome, the exhibits are judged by the visiting public; tea, scones and home-made cakes will also be available.

#### JOBS TO DO IN JULY

Feed, water and deadhead flowers in containers regularly. If the soil is dry, water camellias and rhododendrons to ensure a good flower display next year. Collect and store seeds for future sowing. Cut back hardy geraniums after flowering. Plant autumn-flowering bulbs. Feed roses after deadheading them. Harvest vegetables as soon as they are ready. Sow vegetables for autumn harvesting e.g. beetroot, carrots and turnips. Harvest and store garlic once the foliage has turned yellow. Plant out winter-and spring-maturing brassicas. Harvest annual herbs regularly. Keep bird baths topped up with clean water.

Our June book was PD James's Death Comes to Pemberlev which is a sequel to Jane Austen's Pride and Prejudice. For some of us it was a second reading, having read it when it was first published - and quite a few of us are dedicated Austen admirers. Unsurprisingly it had a mixed reaction. Some of us took the plot at face value and enjoyed the dramatic murder in the woodlands surrounding Pemberley, the apparent guilt of Wickham as the perpetrator and the impact of this drama on Darcy and Elizabeth. In true PD James style there were numerous false trails and red herrings before the real culprit is revealed at the end of the novel. Others in our group became rather irritated by the basic premise that Jane Austen should be turned into a crime/ murder mystery in this fashion.....the word "travesty" was used by one of us. We had a very lively discussion on the way PD James had handled the main characters of Elizabeth and Darcy and misgivings were expressed at the way in which the novel concluded with inconvenient babies being adopted and Lydia and Wickham being despatched to the colonies! This novel aroused strong feelings. It is interesting to note that PD James was 90 when she wrote this and we did not doubt that it was intended as a genuine homage to Austen.

The award, agreed unanimously by the Guild at their recent AGM in Wimborne, was presented by Ivan Andrews, himself a long-established local ringer at Bradpole and a Vice President of the Guild. In his citation, Ivan pointed to Basil's dedication to the Guild, having served as a member of the West Dorset Branch committee until 2014. He also drew attention to Basil's ongoing commitment to training new ringers and supporting other local towers where there are insufficient ringers to enable bells to be rung for special events, especially weddings. Praising Basil's outstanding service to the assembled ringers and the congregation, Ivan said, "Basil is not only a dedicated ringer who maintains a keen and regular band, but he is well liked by everyone, partakes in many aspects of church and village life and supports various organisations and charities; a full and complete list of all his activities would take some time to recall." As Captain, Basil continues to lead the regular practice each Thursday evening from 7.00 pm and visiting ringers from other towers or those interested in taking up ringing for the first time are always welcome to attend.


