Reading: Colossians 3: 12-17

Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Thought for the day

We find ourselves in very strange circumstances this Mothering Sunday. Many will find themselves separated from families, friends and neighbours. Many will be anxious about loved ones, health, work or businesses, financial pressures, physical needs, social needs and much else besides.

It's a testing time, a time when we need each other more and more. When the work of mothering becomes even more the work of all of us. Looking after friend and stranger, as if they were a mother or child of our own.

It's easy to get so focused on our own needs that we neglect others, but already people are pulling together, organising support networks or just extending offers of help on an individual basis. The qualities that St Paul speaks of in his letter to the Colossians are showing through amidst the panic buying and fear. Paul also encourages us to find strength in prayer and discover afresh the love of God to sustain us and all life.

Finally, take care not to overlook the shortest sentence in this reading: "And be thankful." Give thanks for the love, kindness and compassion that you are able to show to others, and that you have received from others.

God our helper and protector, in times of plenty and need, you cradle our life in your hands. We entrust to your care all in any kind of need at this difficult time. Encircle them with your love and keep them ever within your tender mercy.
