Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?' ³⁶Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here.' ³⁷ Pilate asked him, 'So you are a king?' IMPORTANT: SAFEGUARDING CONCERNS

Since the Makin Review was published recently, diocesan safeguarding teams around the country have seen a rise in disclosures being reported, particularly relating to non-recent abuse. This has been echoed in Salisbury as well. The Safe Spaces helpline have been used to having on average 2-3 phone calls a day and overnight saw this rise to hundreds of calls a day.
