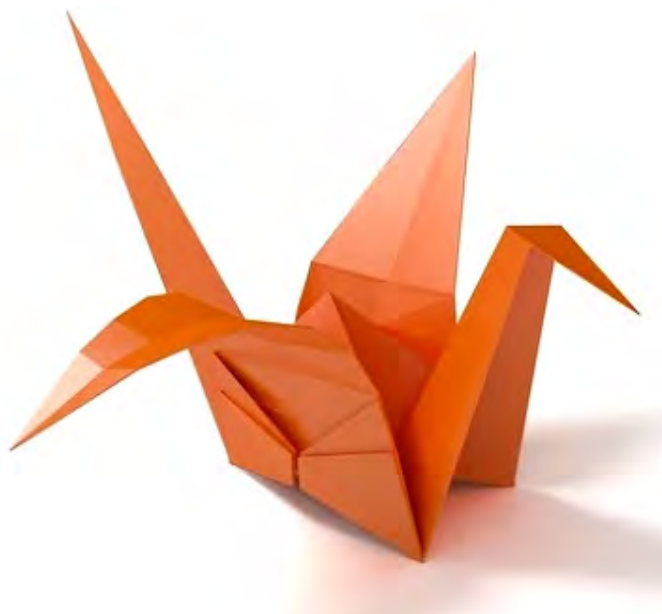

The cover picture this month shows a paper crane, for the United Nations International Day of Peace, which is on Saturday, 21 September. In Japan, the paper crane became a symbol of peace after the bombing of Hiroshima. One victim of Leukaemia from exposure to the atomic bomb named Sadako Sasaki started folding 1000 paper cranes, believing if she did, she would get a wish granted by the Gods. After Sadako Sasaki passed away, paper cranes became a symbol of world peace and The Children's Peace Monument was erected in Hiroshima.

From the Rectory

Dear Friends,

How do we 'patiently put up with each other and love each other' (Ephesians 4:2)? We reflected on this recently at a mid-week Holy Communion service, considering 'the bread of life' and this Bible verse.

How do we patiently put up with and love each other in our homes? Statistically there may be 'domestic abuse' in some of our homes. How do we patiently put up with each other in our villages, with neighbours, with tourists, particularly on the busy narrow roads? Are we patient and loving when we look at the news, and see dead and injured children, protests, riots and violence, war and suffering, migrants looking for a better life and safety? We may want and need justice, but are our thoughts loving? The Bible verse includes: 'with all humility and gentleness'. That can be our biggest challenge: to find the humility to admit that we easily judge others, even if only in our thoughts, though none of us are perfect. We can feel entitled. Maybe we have been spoilt. But all of us at some times have needed people to be patient with us, to put up with us and love us, with all our faults.

Our reflection included recognition that sometimes we struggle because we can't be patient, put up with and love ourselves. We feel unlovable. We get anxious. We get angry. We cannot let go of the past. We still carry feelings of imperfection, punishment and shame, often from childhood, maybe from church. We feel hard done by. We become hardline, resentful, jealous. The power at the heart of the Christian faith is the power of forgiveness and the unconditional love that gently and patiently receives us with open arms of love. Right now, you may find it difficult to patiently put up with and love others. You may find it difficult to love yourself. Please don't harm yourself or others. But divine love understands. Divine love can bear all your impatience, all your pain and lack of self-love. Divine love offers you the gift of peace, 'the bread of life', and a fresh start.

The BVCS is a volunteer scheme offering residents of the Bride Valley transport to and from medical appointments when they are unable to drive themselves or be driven by relatives or friends.

National Coastwatch

NCI LYME BAY VOLUNTEERS FLY THE FLAG

Volunteers at Lyme Bay have been flying the flag for coastal safety by taking part in a 2,000-plus miles station-to-station relay as part of the National Coastwatch charity's 30th anniversary celebrations. The special anniversary flag is travelling anti-clockwise to each of the charity's 60 coastal watch stations during the summer. It started in Fleetwood, Lancashire and will end its journey in



September at the most northerly station on the east coast in Filey, North Yorkshire. Sirius Insight, a leading technology company using AI (artificial intelligence) to transform safety and security at sea, is sponsoring the national flag relay.

At NCI Charmouth, volunteers received the flag on 13th July from watchkeepers at NCI Exmouth who arrived on foot. On 14th July the flag left Charmouth on foot along the South West Coast Path via The Anchor Pub at Seatown to West Bay. It passed through West Bay in the afternoon and departed by gig *Bucky Doo*,



escorted by the gig *Blaize* and a motor launch, *Shearwater*, owned by a watchkeeper, en-route to Hive Beach, Burton Bradstock. From the gig the flag was swum ashore and greeted by The High Sheriff of Dorset, Mr Anthony Woodhouse, the Station Manager and fellow watchkeepers. Station Manager for Lyme Bay, Judy Clarke said: “This year is an exciting milestone and it’s great for us all to come together, take part in some extra fundraising and have some fun in our own community at the same time.”



On Monday 15 July the relay continued with the flag leaving NCI Lyme bay at 10:30 en-route to NCI Portland. The Flag travelled by ‘tramper’, an off-road mobility aid, provided by Countryside Mobility and courtesy of the National Trust at Hive Beach, accompanied by Tamarisk Farm horses, to Bindbarrow, then Tamarisk Farm horses, to West Bexington.

Our Night Sky in September 2024

Saturn will be rising in the East about 20.00 followed by Jupiter and Mars at about 23.00. Saturn will be setting at about 05.00 whilst Mars and Jupiter will still be visible until day break. All of these planets will be brilliant objects throughout the night, with Jupiter being particularly prominent. We welcome Orion rising in the East at about 02.00



Gravitational waves are travelling ripples in time and space. Space time is rather like a rubber sheet. Massive objects like neutron stars and orbiting binary stars, or especially black holes, can deform this sheet of space time; A gravitational wave is a ripple in that sheet, and that ripple travels with the speed of light; it carries energy, it carries momentum, and it can carry information about the objects that produced it. We have built a gravitational wave detector so that we can read those waves, and, use them to understand the objects that produced them. The detectors are the space telescopes – the James Webb, and the Euclid whose detectors combine information to provide a 3-dimensional view of the Universe, stretching back to the Big Bang. Since they use Infra-Red, they are able to penetrate the dust clouds that normally prevent telescopes seeing beyond them

I am finding it difficult to keep up with all that is happening in our fascinating Universe!

Bride Valley Book Group Review

Our meeting in early August was thinly attended - holidays, summer visitors and Covid all played their part. Our current book was **“Loki” by Melvin Burgess** - a re-telling of the Norse myths in Loki's voice. We were aware of the popular film franchise featuring the rival Norse gods Thor and Loki but none of us had seen this. Most of us struggled with this novel often finding the narrative style difficult. Like the Greek/Roman myths - the Norse stories tend not to be chronological. Loki's voice as the trickster, shape shifting god was convincing and the back story to his rivalry with Thor is explained. Some of the stories are particularly visceral and shocking in their telling and this did not make for a relaxing read. Some of us knew these stories from childhood and it was noted that the writer had made some distinct changes which led to a feeling of frustration. At least one of our group thoroughly enjoyed the book but most of us were underwhelmed. Our next book is by Ali Smith, a novelist we admire and are familiar with - hopefully normal service will be resumed.

Warning from Dorset Police

Over the last few months we have had several reports from members of the public who have received calls from persons purporting to be Police Officers. The supposed Police Officers give their name, a collar number (they have called it a badge number on occasion), a Police Station, will say something about your bank account being compromised, you can help catch them and will then ask for your bank details. They talk about transferring it to a safe account or ask you to withdraw some money and a Police Officer will collect it.



The persons will try and rush you into a decision, they will say this is urgent and it needs to be done now and it can't wait. All of this is a scam.

Every time you answer the phone be it a landline or mobile unless you know the caller, please STOP THINK TAKE 5 MINUTES. The Police will never ask you to do anything like this, nor will the Bank or other organisations. Never rush into anything you have been asked of by someone phoning you. Please put the phone down and speak with a family member, neighbour or a person you trust. Based on the book If It's Not Impossible, which tells the story of Nicholas Winton, a young London broker who visits Prague in 1938 to convince the British Committee for Refugees in Czechoslovakia to rescue hundreds of predominantly Jewish children before the Nazis closed the border. 50 years later Winton is haunted by the

fate of the children he wasn't able to save but then the BBC show That's Life reintroduced him to some of those he helped to rescue and he finally came to terms with his grief and guilt. As a result of the programme he was rocketed from anonymity to a national hero.

Garden Jobs to do in September

Take cuttings of pelargoniums, salvias and fuchsias and protect over winter. Keep deadheading tender perennials but be prepared to lift them before the first frosts. Water asters during dry spells to prevent powdery mildew. Start planting winter bedding. Amaryllis and prepared hyacinth bulbs can be planted now for flowers at Christmas. Plant out lettuce seedlings, spring cabbages, garlic and autumn (Japanese) onion sets. Establish new strawberry plants while the soil is warm. Cut down fruited summer raspberry canes to ground level. Net ponds in preparation for leaf fall.

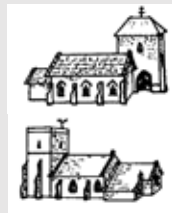

My dear Nephew Darren,

Eventually we reached a perfect compromise: doing something which made no change whatsoever. Miss Simpson was charged with buying yards of sticky backed plastic and repairing the current books. She put a note on the front of every copy that if the page for the hymn they wanted was missing, they should share with the person sitting next to them - an experience which will be almost as traumatic as being invited to pass the peace. Yet another decision has thereby been deferred for a Church Council to make some time next century. Harmony reigns once again.

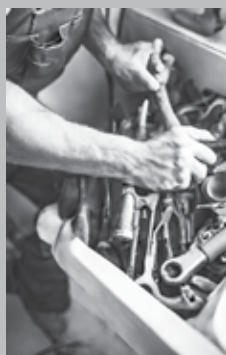
